## TRAINING AND SUPPORTS

Training and support groups are available to teach parents about the effects of abuse and neglect, child development issues, as well as other information relevant to parenting children in DCF custody.

## KID'S NET HELPLINE

The Kid's Net after-hours telephone helpline provides emergency assistance when DCF offices are closed. Staffed by social workers experienced in foster care, the Helpline is available from 5 P.M. to 9 A.M. during the week, 24 hours a day on weekends, and holidays.

## FAMILY RESOURCE LIAISONS

Family Resource Liaisons (FRLs) are foster parents who have been selected as mentors and guides for other foster parents. FRLs offer support, advice, and information to all foster, kinship, and pre-adoptive families.

## RESPITE

Respite provides overnight care for foster children. Parents are entitled to ten days/nine overnights of respite per year, if available. Contact your area office to arrange care.

## SHORT-TERM CHILD CARE

Child care services provided by licensed child care professionals are offered in many locations to allow foster parents free time.

For emergencies, such as:

- Escalating conflict between a foster child and other family members
- Threatening or aggressive behavior that does not require immediate police assistance
- Reporting an emergency room visit
